## Visiting Places of Interest Around Ludhiana

#### **AMRITSAR (140 KM)**



#### **Golden Temple**

The Golden Temple is located in the holy city of the Sikhs, Amritsar. The Golden Temple is famous for its full golden dome, it is one of the most sacred pilgrim spots for Sikhs. The Golden Temple is built on a 67-ft square of marble and is a two storied structure.



#### Jallianwala Bagh

Jallianwala Bagh is a historic garden and 'memorial of national importance' close to the Golden Temple complex in Amritsar, Punjab, India, preserved in the memory of those wounded and killed in the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre that occurred on the site on the festival of Baisakhi, 13 April 1919.



#### **Durgiana Temple**

The temple is built in the middle of a sacred lake, which measures 160 metres (520 ft)  $\times$  130 metres (430 ft). Its dome and canopies are similar to that of the Golden Temple of Sikh religion, also located in Amritsar. A bridge provides the approach to the temple. The dome of the temple is gilded.



#### Wagah Border

Wagah Border near Amritsar is the border crossing that demarcates the boundary between India and Pakistan. Ever since the country gained independence in 1947, it has been serving as a road link between the two countries India & Pakistan.



#### Sada Pind

Besides the religious places in Amritsar, there are many places that represent the cultural beauty of the city. Sada Pind is one of that places which represents and highlights the cultural attraction of the city Amritsar. The place is well spread in a region of 12 acres and thus offers maximum space for exploring all the highlights of traditional Punjab. For people who are looking for a place to explore the cultural attractions of Punjab, this place is where you should head to.

#### **CHANDIGARH (100 KM)**



#### Rose Garden

Zakir Hussain Rose Garden, is a botanical garden in Chandigarh, India and spread over 30 acres (120,000 m2) of land, with 50,000 rose-bushes of 1600 different species.



#### Rock Garden

The Rock Garden of Chandigarh is a sculpture garden for rock enthusiasts in Chandigarh, India. It is also known as Nek Chand Saini's Rock Garden of Nathupur after its founder Nek Chand Saini, a government official who started building the garden secretly in his spare time in 1957.



#### Sukhna Lake

Sukhna Lake in Chandigarh, India, is a reservoir at the foothills (Shivalik hills) of the Himalayas. This 3 km² rainfed lake was created in 1958 by damming the Sukhna Choe, a seasonal stream coming down from the Shivalik Hills. Originally, the seasonal flow entered the lake directly causing heavy siltation.



#### Piniore Garden

Yadavindra Gardens, also known as Pinjore Gardens, is a historic 17th century garden located in Pinjore city of Panchkula district in the Indian state of Haryana. Panchkula city is nearby it. It is an example of the Mughal Gardens architectural style, which was renovated by the Patiala Dynasty Sikh Rulers.



#### Japanese Garden

This Japanese style park showcase the Japanese culture, art and various types of plants. The main attractions of this garden include a pagoda tower, meditation hut, Zen garden, statues of Buddha, a small pond with pretend crocodiles, a bridge over the pond and much more. There are 4 water bodies in the garden and wooden bridges have been constructed over them. At night, the garden looks astonishing as the walk-ways have been illuminated with Japanese lanterns.

#### PARWANOO (130 KM)



Parwanoo is a scenic hill station located in Solan district of Himachal Pradesh. It encompasses beautiful orchards and is encircled by lush greenery. It is a wholesome package in itself, comprising of historic places, temples and lovely gardens. One of the top things to do in Parwanoo is to satiate your taste buds with flavored Himachal Pradesh cuisines.

## Visiting Places of Interest Around Ludhiana

#### KASAULI (150 KM)



Located at 1927 m above sea level Kasauli is a small hill station in Himachal Pradesh. Surrounded by dense forests, Kasuali is home to several species of Himalayan flora and fauna including endangered ones. Snow-clad mountains, dense forests and a pleasant climate make Kasauli a major draw among tourists.

#### **SOLAN (180 KM)**



A beautiful city in Himachal Pradesh, Solan has ancient temples and monasteries that attract hundreds of tourists and devotees every year. Solan has one of the oldest breweries in the country and is popularly known as the mushroom capital of the country, owing to the amount of mushrooms produced every year. This city also has a 300-year old fort located at the top of a hill in ruins but has an awe-inspiring panoramic view of the countryside.

### **DHARAMSHALA (190 KM)**



Dharamshala is the winter capital of Himachal Pradesh, India. It serves as administrative headquarters of the Kangra district after being relocated from Kangra in 1855 located 18 km away from Dharamshala.

#### SHIMLA (220 KM)



Shimla is the capital of Himachal Pradesh and a popular hill-station among Indian families and honeymooners. Situated at the height of 2200m, Shimla was the summer capital of British India. Shimla still retains its old-world charm with beautiful colonial architecture, pedestrian-friendly Mall Road and the ridge lined up with multiple shops, cafes and restaurants.

#### DALHOUSIE (250 KM)



Dalhousie is a popular hill station in Himachal Pradesh, boasting views of the snow-capped peaks of the Dhauladhar ranges. Dalhousie is famous for its meadows, dense jungles, and waterfalls. It offers an oldworld charm, mesmerizing natural landscapes, pine-clad valleys and magnificent misty mountains. The Scottish and Victorian-era architecture of churches reminds of its colonial heritage.

#### **CHAMBA (270 KM)**



Chamba is a Himalayan town located in Chamba district of Himachal Pradesh. Known for the ancient temples, the caves, and the edifices that speak highly of Indian history, Chamba is famous for mesmerising views of the Pir Panjal, Zanskar and Dhauladhar ranges in the backdrop of this picture-postcard town. This Himalayan town is located at an elevation of 996 meters on the banks of river Ravi, flanked by Jammu and Kashmir, Lahaul and Kangra.

#### **KASOL (320 KM)**



Kasol is a quaint little village in Himachal situated along the banks of the river Parvati. Commonly known as the 'Amsterdam of India', Kasol is a tourist attraction that is rapidly gaining fame as a popular hub for trekkers, backpackers, and nature lovers. Kasol is situated 23 kms from Bhuntar and next to the religious town of Manikaran and is one of the best places in the country just to sit back and chill in the panorama of snow-clad mountains, pine trees and gurgling river.

#### MANALI (340 KM)





The airport runway is located in the union territory of Chandigarh while the terminal is located on the south side of the runway in the village of Jhiurheri, Mohali.


